There is the possibility of being connected to the public water and electricity network. The property also has access to a well.

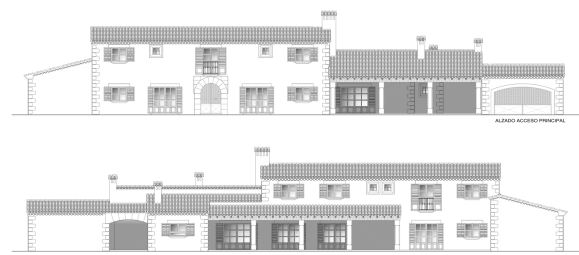

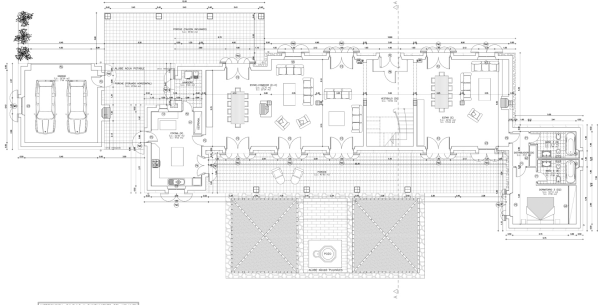
